
As we approach the close of 2024, the Michigan Baseball Foundation (MBF) reflects on our ongoing mission to support and strengthen the Great Lakes Bay Region. Throughout this year and since our inception, we have remained dedicated to enriching our communities through youth-focused initiatives, philanthropic endeavors, and maintaining Dow Diamond as a premier gathering place. This work would not be possible without the unwavering support of our Loons fans, community partners, and generous contributors through the MBF Dow Diamond All-Stars initiative.

Since 2008, MBF has awarded 353 grants totaling nearly \$1.55 million to non-profit organizations across the Great Lakes Bay Region. In 2024, we distributed \$89,565 in grants to support a wide range of impactful community projects spanning Bay, Midland, Ogemaw, Saginaw, and Tuscola counties. These projects include resurfacing tennis courts, creating nature-based STEM learning classrooms, installing security systems, and renovating athletic facilities.

MBF is also committed to maintaining Dow Diamond as a premier Minor League Baseball facility and events center. Over the past two years, we've invested \$3.97 million to meet Major League Baseball's updated facility standards and address critical infrastructure needs. This season, we installed new protective netting extending down the foul lines to the bullpens on both sides of the field. Made from state-of-the-art Kevlar, this nearly invisible netting offers 97% visibility while enhancing safety for our guests. In addition, we upgraded our LED lighting system, which improves visibility for players and adds dynamic, music-synced light shows during in-game highlights. We are also undertaking a full renovation of our playing surface to further elevate the experience for both players and fans.

Your continued support ensures that Dow Diamond remains a community hub for all. The following pages will highlight the achievements of Dow Diamond, the Great Lakes Loons, and Sports Radio 100.9 The Mitt in 2024—all made possible by your generous contributions. We look forward to welcoming you to the ballpark for many more seasons to come.

Michigan Baseball Foundation's philanthropic efforts demonstrated remarkable diversity in line with our core mission. Alongside our continuous support for sports, fitness, and education, we have maintained strong partnerships with organizations dedicated to promoting inclusivity for individuals with developmental and cognitive challenges. Our steadfast commitments to this charitable outreach within our region remains unwavering.

In 2024, MBF positively impacted 15 non-profit organizations, granting a total of \$89,565. To date, our organization has contributed over \$1.55 million in charitable grants.

Dow Diamond Continued Improvements



The Michigan Baseball Foundation is committed to keeping Dow Diamond a premier destination for baseball and events. Over two years, MBF has invested \$3.97 million to meet MLB's updated standards and improve infrastructure. This includes installing nearly invisible Kevlar netting with 97% visibility, extending safety down the foul lines. The new LED lighting system enhances visibility for players and adds dynamic light shows. Additionally, MBF is replacing the playing surface to ensure the best experience for athletes and fans alike.



Sports Radio 100.9 The Mitt

Sports Radio 100.9 The Mitt just celebrated its one-year anniversary as a Fox Sports affiliate and its all-new programming lineup led by nightly in-house show, The Payoff. The Mitt serves to support the Michigan Baseball Foundation and provide the Great Lakes Bay Region hyper-local sports coverage and marketing solutions to foster community growth. This year, 100.9-FM produced over 165 local sports broadcasts including every Great Lakes Loons game and over 30 high school broadcasts

covering 23 different schools in the Great Lakes Bay Region. The Mitt also contributed \$5,000 as part of 10 scholarships to the best high school scholar-athletes in our region.





The Payoff, presented by Forward Corporation, has emerged as the Great Lakes Bay Region's premier local sports show, featuring host Ben Bosscher as he delivers insightful hyper-local sports opinions and engaging conversations. Covering teams from the Lions and Tigers to the Pistons, Red Wings, Wolverines, Spartans, and local sports highlights, The Payoff has quickly become a beloved platform for fans in our community, fostering a deeper connection to the sports we love.
